Entry requirements

Individual employers will set the selection criteria for their apprenticeships in discussion with the University.

A minimum 2:2 Honours degree (or for older qualifications a Professional Diploma) in a healthcare related discipline. Relevant clinical experience or previous postgraduate qualifications will also be considered as part of the admissions process.

Registration with the appropriate statutory regulatory body for the profession (such as the HCPC or NMC) and two years post registration clinical experience.

Evidence of English and Maths attainment at Level 2 will be required prior to the End Point Assessment.
